COMPETITION FORMAT

This Competition Format is based on the International Federation's Regulations, and will take place as follows:

ELIMINATION SYSTEM:

CLASSIFICATION: all 190 athletes participate

FINAL: The top 6 or 8 athletes in the classification event in the Olympic categories as per the current ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

TIEBREAKER CRITERIA:

Will follow what is established by the current ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations

COMPETITION FORMAT:

- Individual and teams
- Teams made up of 3 athletes each.
- 16 announced events (10 for men and 6 for women)
- 20 men's titles (10 individual and 10 for teams)
- 11 women's titles (6 individual and 5 for teams)
- The competition will take place according to the current ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF COMPETITORS

According to the CACSO established quota for the Shooting competition, there will be **190** athletes in this competition.

A country may enter a maximum of **26** athletes to compete in the Central American and Caribbean Games, Veracruz 2014 as long as they have earned their slots. A maximum of 3 qualified athletes per event may be entered, those who compete in the individual events and teams of 3 shooters each, except for women's trap, where the competition will only be individual.



VERACRUZ 2014 QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

a) Competitors will obtain up to 185 slots for the Central American and Caribbean Championship that will take place in Guatemala, April 14th to 21st, 2013. The athletes that participate in this event are required to have an ISSF ID number.

b) CTCC and CACSO will set apart 5 slots for exceptional cases (wild cards), if these are not used, they will be distributed as per the CTCC Qualification System.

c) Qualification specifications for the Central American and Caribbean Championship, 2013:

1. Men's:

Rifle (50m. prone, 3 positions y 10m. air)

The top 3 teams in each event will qualify. Those teams will be allowed to enter in the rest of the events as well. If a country qualifies in more than one event with a team that contains at least one non-qualified athlete in the previous events, they may enter up to 4 athletes to make up the teams in the necessary combinations, each team will contain 3 athletes each.

Pistol

50m and 10m Air

The top 3 teams in each event will qualify. Those teams will be allowed to enter in the rest of the events as well.

25m rapid fire and 25m pistol



The top 3 teams in each event will qualify. Those teams will be allowed to enter in the rest of the events as well.

Skeet

Skeet

The top 5 teams will qualify, each team will be made up of 3 competitors.

Trap and double trap

The top 3 teams in each event will qualify. Those teams that are made up of 3 athletes each will be allowed to enter in the rest of the events as well. If they qualify for a second event, with a team made up of at least 2 unqualified athletes in previous events, they may enter up to 5 athletes to make up the teams in the necessary combination resulting in teams of 3 athletes each.

Athletes that place 1st, 2nd and 3rd individually and who's country has not entered a team or who's country's team has not qualified.

2. Women's

Rifle (50m prone, 3 positions and 10m. air)

The top 3 teams in each event will qualify. Those teams will be allowed to enter in the rest of the events as well. If a country qualifies in more than one event with a team that contains at least one non-qualified athlete in the previous events, they may enter up to 4 athletes to make up the teams in the necessary combinations, each team will contain 3 athletes each.

Pistol (25m and 10m. Air)

The top 3 teams in each event will qualify. Those teams that are



made up of 3 athletes each will be allowed to enter in the rest of the events as well. If they qualify for the second event, with a team made up of at least one athlete that did not qualify for other events, they may enter up to 4 athletes to be combined in teams as long as each team has 3 competitors each.

Skeet

Trap: The top 10 individual places will qualify.

Athletes that place 1st, 2nd and 3rd, individually and belong to a country that did not enter or has not yet qualified.

d) If the amount of slots for this dispute is not fulfilled, the slots will be filled by individual athletes and teams that participated in the Qualifying Events, as per the following procedure:

1. In the events that have not qualified 5 teams
2. Athletes that placed 4th, 5th and 6th place individually and whose country has not presented a team or who's team did not qualify.
3. In the events where 6 teams did not qualify.
4. Athletes that place 7th, 8th and 9th place individually and whose country has not presented a team or whose team did not qualify.
5. If there are still empty slots remaining, the procedure will continue.

e) Slots are earned for the country, not the athlete.

f) National Federations must inform CTCC of the number of athletes



to be entered before the closing of the entry by number period on **August 15th, 2014**. Empty slots, as well as slots that become available due to disqualified athletes, doping, suspensions, injuries, etc. will be re-distributed according to the existing qualification system. The Organizing Committee must be informed of this no later than **August 20th, 2014**, so the NOCs are able to comply with the CACSO regulations regarding entry by name and number.

Qualification system approval

Took place as follows:

- a) It was discussed and approved by the Executive Committee Meeting in Guatemala on February 23rd, 2012.
- b) It was submitted for consideration by members of CTCC's National Federations

It was definitively approved at the CTCC meeting on April 17th, 2012 in London, England, with the presence of all the CTCC member federations that were present at the ISSF General Assembly.



TECHNICAL MEETING

- The Technical Meeting will take place **Friday, November 14th**, at the competition venue at 10:30 am.
- Up to two representatives from each NOC will be able to assist this Technical Meeting.
- The invitation card for the Technical Meeting will be available to the Heads of Team at the Sports Information Center at the Central American and Caribbean Village upon their arrival.
- The Technical Delegate and the Organizing Committee's Competition Manager for Shooting will preside the meeting, which shall take place in Spanish and English.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Technical officials will be named as follows:

Technical Delegate: Rafael Guerra Molinedo – Designated by the American Shooting Confederation (CAT)

Members of juries and international judges: proposed by the Technical Delegate, approved by the CTCC and CAT.

International judges and other technical personnel: Proposed by FEMETI and approved by the Technical Delegate.



PROTESTS AND APPEALS

Protests and appeals will be resolved according to what is established in the current ISSF statutes, rules and regulations.

In any situation that is unforeseen by the ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations, protests and appeals will be resolved according to what is established by the Organizing Committee and CACSO.

APPROVED SPORTS EQUIPMENT

Official sports equipment will follow what has been established in the current ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

WEAPONS CONTROL

The procedure for weapons control for athletes, as well as ammunition and accessories will be submitted to the temporary import process which will be sent to the participating NOCs in June, 2014.



TORONTO 2015 QUALIFICATION

The Olympic events for Shooting will lead to slots for the Pan American Games, Toronto 2013 in the following manner:

A slot will go to the individual gold medal winner of the 14 announced Olympic events:

Men's:

- 1 slot: Men's 10m Air Rifle
- 1 slot: Men's 50m Rifle Prone
- 1 slot: Men's 50m Rifle 3 Positions
- 1 slot: Men's 10m Air Pistol
- 1 slot: Men's 50m Pistol
- 1 slot: Men's 25m Rapid Fire Pistol
- 1 slot: Men's Trap
- 1 slot: Men's Double Trap
- 1 slot: Men's Skeet

Women's:

- 1 slot: Women's 10m Air Rifle
- 1 slot: Women's 50m Rifle 3 Positions
- 1 slot: Women's 10m Air Pistol
- 1 slot: Women's 25m Pistol
- 1 slot: Women's Trap



MEDAL CEREMONIES

Medal ceremonies will take place according to CACSO's General Regulations, Chapter XIII.

Individual Events:

- First place: Gold medal and diploma
- Second place: Silver medal and diploma
- Third place: Bronze medal and diploma

Team Events:

- First place: A diploma for the team and a gold medal and diploma for each athlete
- Second place: A diploma for the team and a silver medal and diploma for each athlete
- Third place: A diploma for the team and a bronze medal and diploma for each athlete

CTCC GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The General Assembly of the Central American and Caribbean Shooting Confederation as part of the XXII Central American and Caribbean Games, Veracruz 2014 will take place at a location and time to be determined, taking into consideration that it not overlap with the competition schedule. This information will be made known once it has been confirmed.



COMPETITION VENUE

The Shooting competition will take place at the el Lencero Police Academy, which can be found on Carretera Xalapa Veracruz, Finca Kilometro 11.5, Lencero, 91634 Emiliano Zapata, Veracruz-Llave, Mexico.
